A Heart of Love

On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus' mother was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no more wine." "Woman, why do you involve me?" Jesus replied. "My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." (verses 1-5)
(read John 2:1-12)

No doubt about it! Mary is Jesus' mother. Even after Jesus responds to her statement about the wine with what appears to be an outright refusal to act, Mary has faith in her son and instructs the servants to be ready for Jesus to act. How well she knows his heart.

But then, the heart of Jesus is there for everyone to see. He says openly that he has come to seek and save the lost, heal the sick, lift up those who have fallen, show the way to those who are lost, give sight to the blind and life to the dying. The heart of Jesus is a heart of love.

This heart of love is there for you also. Jesus' love extends to all aspects of your life. If Jesus was willing to provide wine for people gathered to celebrate a wedding, how much more is he willing to provide you with all that you need for life and living. Remember this today and always: the heart of Jesus is filled with love for you.

From Pastor Wayne...



Hi! Back a while, the band U2 and the singer B.B. King sang a song entitled “When love comes to town”.

Its opening verses were:

*I was a sailor, I was lost at sea
I was under the waves
Before love rescued me
I was a fighter, I could turn on a
thread
Now I stand accused of the things
I've said.*

*Love comes to town I'm gonna
jump that train
When love comes to town I'm
gonna catch that flame
Maybe I was wrong to ever let you
down
But I did what I did before love
came to town.*

And one of the later verses in the original song went like this:
*I was there when they crucified my
Lord
I held the scabbard when the
soldier drew his sword
I threw the dice when they pierced
his side
But I've seen love conquer the
great divide.*

“When love comes to town....” The great news of the New Testament is that “love *has* come to town” in the person of Jesus of Nazareth. When Jesus, God’s Son, was born, “love came to town”! As you listen to Jesus and as you watch him love and care for people, and out of compassion and love for them act to change their whole lives, can there be any doubt that in Jesus “love came to town”. And as we watch him walk the road to the cross, we see “love conquer the great divide” between us and God: on the cross, Jesus “died for our sins” (1 Cor. 15:3), and made it possible for us to live as God’s forgiven children in a child-Father relationship with Him.

Easter is coming, and once again we have a chance to walk with Jesus from the adoration of Palm Sunday, through to his Last Supper and his arrest on Maundy Thursday, through to his suffering and death on Good Friday, through to God’s raising of him from the dead on Easter Sunday. Come and join us on this pilgrimage with Jesus over this coming Easter. May God bless

you as you spend time with Jesus this Easter and beyond!

Just a few details about what is coming up. On Palm Sunday, at the 10.30 a.m. service, we will be having CHURCH 4 KIDS with the theme "Easter is coming!" Come along and bring the children from your family, *and your extended family*, and let them discover what Easter is all about: through the clowns, the children's songs, and the fun activities.

On Good Friday, we will only have one combined service at 9.00 a.m. Come along and see Jesus suffering God's "no" for *our* sin, which was laid upon Jesus on the cross. And then come along to one of our two services on Easter Sunday, as we rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus, *God's "yes" to Jesus and what He did for us on the cross.*


In the weeks after Easter, we are going to be exploring THE APOSTLES' CREED, which is the Christian church's statement of what we believe. We begin by looking at: "I believe in God, *the Father Almighty*", and cruise forward looking at "Jesus..., His only Son, our Lord", then his birth, life, and death for us, and then *at the end of May* at his ascension.

The end of May is a worship celebration to look forward to. On Sunday, May 28th, Ascension Sunday, we will have the FORMAL OPENING OF GLYNDE REDEVELOPMENT, with a Bring and Share Community Lunch afterwards. On that day, we will have one combined service at 10.00 a.m.

"When love comes to town".... Love has come to town in the person of Jesus, God's Son, and he has changed the whole life of each of us. He challenges each of us to follow him: loving and caring for the people around us, and making a real difference for him in this world. "Love can do anything" is the theme of this Easter edition of AT GLYNDE. May the risen Jesus empower you with his Spirit to love like him, and do wonderful things for God.

May God bless us as together we build one another up and encourage one another in our faith; and as together we reach out into our community with the Good News of God's love, and His forgiveness through Jesus. May God bless us as we "reveal and celebrate God's love, so that **all** may know Jesus and worship *God through him*".

We are planning to offer an opportunity to give a thanksgiving gift as part of this opening. Lutheran Community Care (LCC) is also keen to celebrate the new look and access to our building and will be holding an open day on Saturday May 8 as part of Families Week. Please come and have a look at the work that they do in our community and meet their staff. We will also be able to welcome Andrea Koningsman as the new Manager, Foster Care Services.

We thank God for his love and care for Pastor Wayne and for all those who lead in ministry areas. By the time this edition is being read, Barbara Mattiske will have been newly installed as our Cross Cultural Outreach Coordinator. It is a great

blessing to have her accepting our call to this work and for us to be able to formally welcome her into this role. It is through this ministry and the range of outreach activities at Glynde that many are finding a place of new friendships, a safe place to bring family and to share their lives in activities during the week and also to link with our Sunday worshippers. The concept of "Week-day" church is gaining momentum!


Some of the notable events of the last few weeks include:

PNG Missionary Fellowship

What do you get when you put together approximately 100 former missionaries who shared time and unique experiences in Papua New Guinea?

First you get a lot of noise as old friends meet up, as they catch up on news, as they reminisce and recall the good times, the fun times, sometimes the just ridiculous times and the challenging times. All add to a sharing that is hard to replicate.

Then there was the precious time of giving glory to God as these former missionaries shared worship with the people at Glynde - so different in many ways from what they had experienced in PNG, yet so much the same. Different in that the open sides of the church building were gone. So were the colourful tropical flowers. But things were also the same. We worshipped the same God together, we gave thanks for God's inestimable love in giving us Jesus that we might have eternal life. The message was the same, whether it was delivered in English, or in pidgin, or indeed in Nuer. The message, 'Jisas sori tru long mi' (Jesus loves me), is the same as it was when missionaries went to PNG to give people this good news, and it's the same today as Glynde shares this message on Sundays and during our mid-week church.

Pastor Richard Haar, himself a former missionary in the beautiful but isolated mountainous area of Menyamyia in PNG, spoke of sharing 'the light'. What a vision it was as he started sharing the light with the traditional song, 'This little light of mine'. First Richard was alone with his light. He shared with two, they each shared with two, and before we knew it, everyone was sharing the light. He urged

us to keep sharing this light of Jesus' love, - in our church, with our families, with our colleagues, with the world!!

On this note, we moved from the church, *through* the foyer (just another thing to celebrate!), and Glynde members and former missionaries enjoyed their lunch.

After lunch our Cross Cultural Coordinator Barb Mattiske, outlined how we, at Glynde, are sharing that light of love, through our many mid-week activities. The general reaction of those listening was along the lines of 'Thank you God' when they heard of our work. Visitors really had a chance to see Glynde in action, with the Korean service and their lunch, then the Sudanese service, all happening at the same time as our guests enjoyed their reunion.

Then thoughts turned back to PNG as all were given an update of current happenings in that land, and the always emotional time as we remembered those who have gone to their eternal home. These former PNG missionaries, many of whom had spent significant periods of time 'spreading the light' had truly experienced that 'God is love' and this enabled them to meet challenges and setbacks and reap a harvest they never dreamed possible.

There are now over 1.2 million Christians all throughout Papua New Guinea. This is approximately 20% of the total 5 million population of the country.

Parenting and Coffee & Chat

What do you do when you keep hearing comments about how hard parenting is? And when you hear people comment on how life seems so different in Australia, not having extended family around to help and for many, being new to Australia, having to deal with language and culture changes.

The need was there to help. God continually bringing new needs and opportunities to share His love with our church groups. So the research began... What course can we do? How do we make sure that language and culture will not become an issue?

We found the Alpha Parenting Course for parents with children 0 – 10 years old. After watching the complete series and reading the book it was obvious this would benefit our church mums. After consulting with people from LCC we decided to proceed.

I knew that the DVD presented the course simply, and uses people from different cultures to talk about the course, and it encourages people to bring with them their cultures into their new surroundings. My only concern was, was I confident enough and informed enough to present this?

So, with some trepidation we held an Information Session. Why did I worry? God had already led us to this course, and God knew that this was what was needed. To begin with, only one person came, then another, and another... we had seven parents come!

Our parenting course will start on **May 19th at 9.45am**. It will be an 8 to 10 week course beginning with a 20 – 30 minute DVD, followed by discussion and then we will join with the Coffee and Chat group for the morning. Everyone can't wait for it to start! You are still most welcome to join us and be amazed at how God works!

Because of this, next term for **Coffee and Chat** we will start a half an hour later at 10.30am. From **May 5th**, **Coffee and Chat** will be from **10.30am – 12noon**. See you here!

Ministry Focus...Know Your Bible!

Bible Studies compiled by CWCI

Christian Women Communicating International (CWCI) is a worldwide, interdenominational, evangelical women's faith ministry which began in Australia in 1957 and is known for its dynamic Bible teaching and relevance to life issues in the 21st century.

Not only does CWCI offer Bible Studies but also conventions, prayer calendars and fellowship through regular correspondence and newsletters throughout the year. The ties are international. Dedicated translators with theologians check the validity and accuracy of studies in numerous languages throughout the world. Hence, we belong to a wider community of Christians connected by these means.

Know Your Bible (KYB) studies are used by over 2,300 women only groups all over Australia with more men and women groups opening up. They are translated in over 45 languages and used in over 70 countries.



Local CWCI events held in city and country areas offer encouragement, inspiration and Bible teaching. Events in and around Adelaide are usually held mid March each year.

What is Know Your Bible?

Know Your Bible (KYB) studies develop Christians in their knowledge of the Bible and in their own Christian journey.

KYB studies are designed to help women, through personal study and group sharing, to know God's Word and its message for today.

The KYB method is designed so that members engage with the Bible passage four ways each week:

- At home answering the daily questions
- In group discussion
- By the Leader's summary after the discussion
- In the printed notes provided with each study

Some benefits of study with Know Your Bible are:

- A daily devotional pattern is established for each person and all are nurtured by God's Word.
- Discussion and fellowship equip us for further service for God.

The KYB method

Four KYB study books are produced each year, three with nine studies and one with five. The studies have daily Bible readings with questions to answer.

Here at Glynde Church, we have two groups running to cater for women who prefer to study in the evening or during the day. Studies run during the school term and in 2017, the studies are as follows:

Term 1 - Gospel of John - Part 2: chapters 11 – 21 (9 weeks)

Term 2 - Haggai and Zechariah (9 weeks)

Term 3 - The Holy Spirit (9 weeks)

Term 4 - Solomon (2 Chronicles 1-9) (5 weeks)

To set the scene and give some background on each new KYB study, an introduction is available in audio and print versions for the current study as well as the previous study on the CWCI Australia website:

The evening group meets at the leader's house on Mondays at 7 pm, while the Friday morning group meets at 9:30am. in the Church meeting room. The first study began on Monday, 8th Feb and Friday, 12th Feb and will continue for 9 weeks. Term 2 study on Haggai and Zechariah, will begin on Monday, 8th May and Friday, 12th May over a 9 week duration.

We are all Christian women from different denominations and welcome all who are interested in studying the Bible. We consider that studying the Bible is like food for our souls. Physical food is essential for our physical wellbeing, so too, is spiritual food for our spiritual wellbeing. Both are essential for life and true peace.

In so thinking, we support others who wish to join us. We are friendly and accepting because we are all on a journey and no person is alike. Only God knows us truly and intimately from the beginning of time and we are all on our own journey of discovery.



This is a call for women who do want to share part of this journey together through the Bible studies. Get connected!
