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Feeding

Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth (Colossians 3:2).

[Read Colossians 3:1-4, 12-17](#)

When all this started, I wondered why I was going all wobbly. I'd wake up with anxiety flooding through my chest, and my stomach was churning so much I couldn't get down even a banana until lunch time. At night-time I'd be tossing and turning in bed, my brain on a spin cycle of worst-case scenarios. I was losing it.

I wondered why that was. I ran through my checklist. I trust in God, don't I? Yes, tick. I know that I'm precious to him and he won't ever abandon me. Yes, tick. I believe that in Jesus I am fully right with God and I have no fear of his judgement. Yes, tick.

So then, why was I all wobbly?

I recalled a great quote I'd found some months ago. It's a two-picture collage. On the left is a snarling, salivating wolf, and under it the word 'Fear'. On the right is a lamb tucked up safely in the arms of the Good Shepherd, and under it the word 'Faith'. At the very bottom, there's the question: 'Fear or faith – which one will win?'

Answer: the one you feed.

I realised I'd been very busy feeding my fear ('the things that are on earth'). I'd quickly become addicted to reading every news story I could find about the virus, as though somehow the more I knew the more I could control it. I was shovelling truck-loads of food into fear's gaping mouth. It's no wonder my fear was growing exponentially.

I stopped feeding it. I put it into lock-down. Now I allow myself one update a day about the virus, and I spend much, much more time feeding my faith ('the things that are above'). I'm making time day and night to dwell in God's word and I'm getting to know God again. When I pray, I'm staying still and quiet long enough to allow his peace to wash through me. I'm setting my mind on his promises, which no virus nor anything else in all of creation is able to shake.

What about you? What are you feeding: your fear or your faith?

My Father, forgive me for looking in all the wrong places for my security. Thank you for calling me back to you, the only safe place in all the world. Lead me to feed on your truth, and sustain me with your promises through the journey ahead. Amen.

He is our constant, unchanging, and ever-present rock. He will be there for each and every one of us as we face the changes that come at us; seemingly all the time these days!

As we support and help each other through the changes in the way our community functions, I hope that we can grow and learn from each other in new ways and see the good in it.

May God continue to be with all of us as we continue to support each other in this new time of living. Be with us all as we prepare to celebrate Easter in new ways. May the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus be the known in our lives that we hold fast to and help us to keep on feeding the faith.

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From Pastor Wayne...

***Hi! Well, our lives are very much in upheaval because of the Corona Virus.** As I write this on Friday, 27th March, I am preparing to move from my Church Office to office@home. The Government has closed all churches, and doesn't allow church staff to work on the church premises. So it's home I go, to work from Mondays to Fridays, *instead of Tues-Friday, and Sunday, with evening meetings and weekend commitments.* Life will be very different for me, as it will be for all of us, *with most of us isolated in our homes, and communicating via telephone, the internet, Messenger etc.*

***Viv's theme for this AT GLYNDE is "unknown, but known". The future is very much "unknown" for all of us,** in the sense that we don't know whether we will remain healthy or not, or even whether we will live through this pandemic. **But what is "known" is God's love for each one of us, and His ongoing care and forgiveness....** No matter what happens to us, we are God's dear forgiven children, and we are in his care, and nothing *not anything, not even death,* can separate us from His loving arms (*Rom. 8:38-39*).

***Each week, we will endeavour to resource you for worship at home. Our situation reminds me of Jenine's and my situation when we went to Port Fairy on March Long Weekend for the Port Fairy Folk Festival.** No worship was made available at the venue, so Jenine and I worshipped on the rocks looking out over the Southern Ocean: we used songs that we know by heart, we read the Bible reading for the day, chatted about what God was saying to us through it, prayed together, blessed one another, and finished with the song, "May the feet of God walk with you".

We will be trying to do something similar for you and to provide you with online resources: with service orders, Children's Time, a copy of the sermon, a sermon Bible study, the prayer points, and some songs to sing. Tim Eckert has been videoing my sermon, plus the prayers, blessing, and final song, *and these have been placed on YouTube.* All this adds up to you having many resources with which to have your own family or individual worship time.

If you know of anyone without email or the internet, please endeavour to share resources with them via the letter box, and to remind them of worship opportunities on the radio and the TV.

***The Pastoral Assistants and myself are setting up a system of caring for one another in these uncertain times: in these times when many of us are isolated at home and with few contacts. Some 20 or so people in our church family will be asked to be CARERS, and to each care for 4-5 people. We are in the process of trying to organise this at the moment....**

And please care for one another regardless: ring one another and text one another, email one another, Messenger one another, Skype one another, and do whatever you can to encourage one another.

***The future is very much “unknown”. But what is “known” through Jesus is the heart of our dear Father in heaven: it is full of love, mercy, and compassion for us, and He will be caring for us through the ups and downs of our future. And this situation will provide us with unique opportunities to live as God’s children, loving and caring for those around us.**

***May God bless you and me in this wartime-like situation as together we build one another up and encourage one another in our faith, and as together we reach out into our community, *in any way that we can*, with the Good News of God’s love, and His forgiveness through Jesus. May God bless us as we “reveal and celebrate God’s love, so that all may know Jesus and worship *God through him*”.**

Casting Our Anxiety On Him

I read a great little article this last weekend on the ABC News website by Andrew Street. "What would Bandit do? I'm taking parenting cues from Bluey to get through the coronavirus pandemic?" I won't spoil the article for you if you haven't read it, however the title refers to the children's cartoon on ABC TV, centered on the young dog Bluey and her family. In the article, Andrew explains how he and his wife have made a promise to each other to 'celebrate this peculiar moment in history, despite everything' as it's enabled them to spend time and experience things as a family that when life is 'normal' they may have missed out on.

In my own household of 4 adults there is often much coming and going. There are times when it feels that we don't see much of each other and miss things that are going on in each other's lives. So, it has been an unexpected but pleasant side effect (for me anyway!) that in our current situation we have been able to see more of each other and share to a greater extent in each other's day.

Saying this, I don't mean to trivialise what is going on in our world at the moment. I understand that there may well be some of us already feeling an acute sense of isolation and separation from family, friends and our faith community. Along with this, our anxiety level may be rising as we face a barrage of news and deal with the increasing impact of COVID-19 on our day-to-day living. There is no doubt that we are in a uniquely uncertain, difficult and challenging time.

Suddenly the future doesn't feel quite so secure and that creates a significant amount of worry for all of us. Andrew Street discusses that an important aspect of their role as parents during this time is not to transmit their anxiety to their children. Rather, as their children look to them, they want their children to know that they are loved and safe no matter what happens. This is exactly the same reassurance that our Father God conveys to us as his children.


In Philippians, Paul says, 'Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.' (Philippians 4:6-7) Peter puts it even more succinctly, 'Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.' (1 Peter 5:7). May you take comfort in this reassurance and may it help provide a spirit of peacefulness for you despite current events.

Please refer to the letter that is in this edition of @Glynde, which was also emailed out last week regarding how we are moving forward as a church community during this time and specifically how we intend to continue supporting and caring for each other.

Please note that our Annual General Meeting that was scheduled for the 3rd May has been postponed. We will still be circulating reports from the Pastor, Chairperson and Cross-Cultural Coordinator at that time, along with an audited financial report from the Treasurer which we'll ask members to ratify electronically. We'll inform you of the process closer to the date.

The church Executive had an extra meeting on the 24th March to ratify many of the actions that had already been taken as well as other matters related to coronavirus. Again, please refer to the letter from Wayne and me. A big thankyou to all Exec members for their insight, wisdom and thoughtfulness at this time and the many actions taken by them. Also particular thanks to Wayne, Angeline, Barb, and Sharyn for the many additional hours they have spent over the last several weeks in putting strategies in place that ensure the ongoing provision of worship, ministry and support here at Glynde.

What do I write?

The situation at the moment has robbed us of what we have known in our world... we all feel as if we are losing control of our lives.

It has robbed us physically from meeting together as a community. It robs us of planning for the future.

We don't do well when we do not know what is happening.

It feels strange – you go to bed and then when you wake up it is still there! I remember feeling like this when I was very sick and thought my days were limited! I remember feeling that I had no control and that everything I knew and loved was under threat!

What did I do? Well, I panicked for a day or so (or many) as I learnt a new world, and a new medical language... But, one night as I lay in my hospital bed, I knew I couldn't do this on my own, and I knew how badly I needed to let God take over. From that moment on I felt a freedom. Even though I couldn't understand what was happening, I knew that God was holding me, keeping me safe, no matter the outcome. And yes, I had to be sensible and learn my new world and language, but I had God in front, beside and behind me - protecting, guiding and teaching me as I moved forward. I am sure many of you have also had a similar experience in your life.

My story is sort of like where we are now... it is a different world, and we now know lots of new words like social distancing, coronavirus etc. Now, once again, we face an unknown, but we do know that God will be with us, we know He loves us and sent His son Jesus to die for each of us.

We know the Holy Spirit lives in our hearts. Let's take comfort and courage from this. Let's keep in contact with each other as best we can... for those who have technology let's use this to care for each other, and to still meet with each other...

That's what we are doing mid-week... Wednesday Playgroup and Grace over Lunch are still meeting via email sharing activities and thoughts and photos...

- mainly music is sharing songs and craft activities and also photos. And we are now receiving sessions from the mainly music organisation that we can share with our Glynde mainly music community.
- our Friday group has already set up a video chat group so we can continue to study the bible together.
- our learning group is still working on how we can move forward.
- English classes are still happening with Dot supplying lessons that we are emailing out and we are moving toward adding a question and answer time.

That was going to happen very soon, but will now happen in May due to the coronavirus, when we will move to share the mid-week groups... Thank you God for leading us all in this direction – thank you for knowing what Glynde needed, when we didn't know ourselves... And I still look forward to Sharyn joining some of our groups and then taking them over online. I feel very blessed to team work with Sharyn and know that she will be a blessing to us mid-week! Thank you Sharyn!

It is strange for all of us, but, it can and will work. Let's give our worries and anxiety to God and remember what we know, that God is there for us, He will not let us go... we can rely on Him.

As I did years ago, I will do now... every day, look around, find 3 things to say thank you for... you will be surprised how many wonderful things there are to say thank you for!

Today – thank you that the sun still shines, thank you for our Glynde community, thank you for the technology we have, thank you...

A letter from Pastor & Chairperson...

March 25th, 2020

Re: Arrangements for Worship and Ministry at Glynde due to COVID-19

Dear Members and Friends,

This is a short letter to let you know what is happening in our church family.

Following Federal Government directives regarding the corona virus and subsequent instructions from Bishop John Henderson, our church is now closed for all worship and ministry until further notice. While this temporarily changes the way in which we will function as a community it is essential that we continue to support and encourage one another in faith during this time.

In regard to worship, we'll be sending out worship resources for you and your family to use each Sunday. These will include service orders, Pastor's sermon, a Bible study, a Children's Time, along with song and prayer resources. Pastor's sermon will also be available on YouTube, as will prayers and the final song from the second service. For those without email, we will attempt to deliver these resources to you (possibly by your 'carer', see below)

We would also encourage you to make use of the resources that LCA Communications and the Commission on Worship have developed for home worship. These can be found on the Church@Home website: <https://www.lca.org.au/churchhome/>.

One of the strengths of our church family is the love, care and support people receive. Although we're unable to meet together in person, it is important that people continue to feel a part of our church family. To this end, we are in the process of setting up a support network where a group of around 4 families and/or individuals are in regular contact with each other. A willing member will be the 'carer' for the group. Communication between families could be by email, phone or other online method. The aim is to continue to support each other, enabling people to retain a sense of connectedness to our church family through this smaller group, while still being able to call on our wider community when needed. More details on this structure will follow shortly. Also, be assured of our continued care for you and your family as you experience significant events in your lives such as birth, baptism, marriage, sickness, and death.

Many of our mid-week ministries will continue, albeit in a different format. Barb Mattiske, our current Cross-Cultural Coordinator, has organised resources online. Groups will 'meet' through email and FaceTime groups. This will enable sharing of photos, stories, and links to sessions. More details are in the accompanying document.

We are pleased to announce that Sharyn Schubert has been appointed as our new Cross-Cultural Coordinator. She and Barb will form our new Cross-Cultural team, with Sharyn as the Cross-Cultural Coordinator and Barb as the Cross-Cultural Mentor. This new arrangement will begin on Wednesday, May 6th. Congratulations Sharyn on your appointment, and may God bless you and Barb as you lead in this ministry.

Our Church hosted the World Day of Prayer service on Friday 6th March, joining 150 countries around the World, in 88 different languages, to pray for Zimbabwe. In Australia 960 Services were held, embracing all Christian Denominations.

The Women of Zimbabwe wrote the service. Zimbabwe means House of Stone. The people are diverse and have a long history. They have faced political violence during national elections and, presently, there are traumas imposed by armed conflicts. Reconciliation is taking longer than had been hoped.



There is much unemployment, and many households are headed by women who have nothing to feed their families, with little or no support from husbands and wider family. Families who have disabled children are discriminated against by all society.



Our guest speaker, Jill Baker, was born in Zimbabwe and grew up with local people who now head different organisations. Much unrest is caused by outside sources. Jill is very passionate about her country and has written a book about the history of the people, of which the proceeds are contributed to her charity, which assists the women who have no Social Service support.



We had approximately 70 people from our church and neighbouring churches attend the service and then join us for afternoon tea. Our collection realised \$840.00 for the Bible Society, who will distribute it to the women and Children of Zimbabwe.

We were overwhelmed with the support we received and sincerely thank all who helped so willingly with the service.

Your favourite book of the Bible??

I pray the thousands of people attending **Adelaide Festival Psalms** will be spiritually blessed.
