And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others (2 Timothy 2:2).

[Read 2 Timothy 2:1–8](#)

Paul sits in a Roman dungeon in chains. He is suffering persecution at the hands of Nero. He can feel that his life is coming to an end. This is the time for his last will and testament. This is his chance to say what is really important. And his thoughts turn to his son in the faith, Timothy.

Paul has been with Timothy at many important times in his faith and life. Timothy has learned so much from Paul. What can Paul say to encourage Timothy in his ongoing ministry? Paul writes, 'You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus'. Be strong in arguments? No. Be strong in military might or physical power? No. Be strong in grace.

And Paul encourages Timothy to pass on what he has learned and teach it to those who can teach others. Paul uses metaphors for Timothy's ongoing work. He is a soldier, trying to please his commanding officer. He is an athlete, competing according to the rules. He is a farmer, who works hard for his share of the crops.

Psalm 145:4 says, 'One generation commends your works to another; they tell of your mighty acts'. As an educator, and more recently as a school chaplain, one of my greatest joys is to talk with students about God and tell them of the wonders of God's love in their own language. And I have been sharing these things for so long that occasionally I have the great joy to hear an adult in their 20s or 30s recite back to me something I told them years ago. I may have forgotten, but they have not.

We all have mentors, and we can all be mentors. Can you think of a mentor, a Paul figure, who has imparted wisdom to you? Do you act as a mentor to one or more Timothys, loving and encouraging them in the ways of God? And if you have not considered yourself a mentor in the past, could you commit to intentionally encouraging others, in your church, family or workplace? Small groups are a wonderful forum for this encouragement, but they are certainly not the only place that mentoring can take place.

May God bless you as you share his grace with those around you.

Heavenly Father, please inspire me with gratitude to those who have mentored me. Please help me look for those I can mentor, encourage and teach, as one generation commends your works to another. Amen

From our Chairperson...

Work.... It's part of life. Some of us hate our work, some of us love our work, some of us, well... just do it...

When people ask me what I do for work, I sometimes feel a bit embarrassed. It's a pretty cushy job, driving around in our amazing state, going from winery to winery, and meeting interesting people from around the world. No wonder I love my work! 😊. It also makes it very easy to thank God for the gifts he has given to me to do that work. I am very thankful and blessed to have the job I do.

Not everyone is the same though. I know people who hate what they do. How do you thank God for a job you despise? How is God using your gifts in that situation?

Imagine that behind every employer stands the Lord Jesus. He sees everything we do, and He appreciates it and will reward us, regardless of the type of work we do. You can then view your work as a labour of love and worship for Jesus. He sees and appreciates what you do, and it can forever change your view of work.

God also wants us to see that work is His gift to us. It is not a result of the Fall. God gave Adam and Eve the job of planting

the garden and exercising dominion over the world before sin entered the world. We were created to work, and for work. Work is God's good gift to us!

I love this passage from Solomon in The Message Bible...

After looking at the way things are on this earth, here's what I've decided is the best way to live: Take care of yourself, have a good time, and make the most of whatever job you have for as long as God gives you life. And that's about it. That's the human lot. Yes, we should make the most of what God gives, both the bounty and the capacity to enjoy it, accepting what's given and delighting in the work. It's God's gift!

Being happy in our work doesn't depend on the work, it depends on our attitude. To make the most of our job and be happy in our work is a gift God wants to give us!

Work is God's gift to us. It is His provision in a number of ways. In "Your Work Matters to God" (Doug Sherman and William Hendricks, Colorado Springs: NavPress, 1987) the authors suggest five major reasons why work is valuable:

1. Through work we serve people. Most work is part of a huge network of interconnected jobs, industries, goods and services that work together to meet people's physical needs. Other jobs meet people's aesthetic and spiritual needs as well.

2. Through work we meet our own needs. Work allows us to exercise the gifts and abilities God gives each person, whether paid or unpaid. God expects adults to provide for themselves and not mooch off others. Scripture says, "If one will not work, neither let him eat!" (2 Thessalonians 3:10)

3. Through work we meet our family's needs. God expects the heads of households to provide for their families. He says, "If anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for his immediate family, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever." (1 Timothy 5:8)

4. Through work we earn money to give to others. In both the Old and New Testaments, God tells us to be generous in meeting the needs of the poor and those who minister to us spiritually.

5. Through work we love God. One of God's love languages is obedience. When we work, we are obeying His two great commandments to love Him and love our neighbour as we love ourselves. We love God by obeying Him from the heart. We love our neighbour as we serve other people through our work.

We bring glory to God by working industriously, demonstrating what He is like, and serving others by cooperating with God to meet their needs. In serving others, we serve God. And that's why our work matters to God.

Speaking of bringing glory to God through their work, we thank and praise God for the blessing that Barb Mattiske has been to this congregation and our community. Thank you, Barb, for everything that you have done voluntarily and as a paid worker, using your God-given gifts to serve others and Him. We wish you well in your fully deserved retirement. Good luck and God's blessings to you & Grant as you move on in the next stage of your lives.

From our Cross-Cultural Coordinator...

Dear Friends in Christ,

In our work we are called to action. The teacher commands, do your work, to the child who is not listening, or copying from someone else or refusing to learn. In John 9v 4 Jesus warns, do your work, the works of Him who sent me while it is day, until the night comes and no one can work". But where then is the grace of God to be found in work?

As I reflect over this term, the role of work becomes clearer as I update you on the mid-week ministries seen below. In work we show our gifts and love. It is not a command but a privilege, not a chore but a blessing. In our work we find purpose and experience humility and gratitude in this service. In work, God's gifts and talents to us become apparent as He works through us.

This last quarter I have seen and experienced within the community a wonderful spirit of co-operation and faithfulness in service to others. Amongst the mid-week ministries there has been enthusiasm for welcoming others and giving time and space for relationships to build.

Playgroup is only small in numbers but we are working towards building numbers through updating the rear hall storage room to make it user-friendly for pre-schoolers and their carers. We have registered with Playgroup S.A. and advertised locally in Council areas. We will also have assistance from high school students for this venture as they undertake their Community service hours.



Mainly Music has been blessed with the talents of the presenters who found many ways of sharing shapes with those who attended. Shapes like the heart, cross and circle were used to teach the community about Easter, God's great love and sacrifice for us all. The last session for Term 1 had a wonderful reminder of the work done.

Grace Over Lunch has seen much sharing of recipes and encouragement of each other in service. The Passover Seder Meal (see photo) was a wonderful time because everyone worked together to create a meaningful, reflective Easter time for all. It was amazing to see how cooking brings out love to each other. In the last session we had a Thai food carver who showed the patience and skills needed in this work. The work was shown to those who attended the other mid-week ministries as a useful conversation piece to consider skills and creativity.



English class on Saturday has continued to progress well as material has been prepared under the skill of Dot Turner. Val Matters and Clarice Seelinger have been wonderful in their flexibility of providing us with nourishments. With our work has come fun times seen in Harmony Day when we all chose to wear Orange (see photos) and where the teachers have all been sung Happy Birthday in three languages, English, Korean and Chinese.



What difference does being a Christian make for our work? God provides us all with gifts these being talents and skills to use in particular ways. How we use such gifts in our work, matters to God. Colossians 3:23-24 says: "Work willingly at whatever you do, as though you were working for the Lord rather than for people. Remember that the Lord will give you an inheritance as your reward, and that the Master you are serving is Christ".

Notes from Board for Ministry and Executive

- Tim Eckert is now our congregation's chairperson. He was elected at the Half-Yearly Meeting in December.
- 15-16th May - District Synod will be held in Tanunda. Tim Eckert was previously elected as a delegate, but now is no longer able to attend. Sharyn and Paul Schubert will attend as our delegates.

- We will continue to pay Greg Scott as COVID Cleaner as long as the COVID-Safe requirements remain.



World Day of Prayer



The service this year was held in the Seventh Day Adventist Church (for the district we are in) on the 5th March 2021, at 6pm. The theme was 'build on a strong foundation', prepared by the Women of Vanuatu.

Vanuatu, in the South Pacific Ocean, is made up of over 80 islands of which about 65 are inhabited today. Its land mass is only one fifth the size of Tasmania, and has a population of 230,000. These are mainly groups of Melanesian and Polynesian people who migrated to these islands over time from 550 BC. Many languages and dialects are spoken.

We were warmly greeted with music by piano and violin which created a very peaceful atmosphere. The speaker was the newly appointed Pastor who had only just arrived from New Zealand and spoke of his experiences while camping in the midst of a storm and our reliance on God in times of need. The offering for communities in need in Vanuatu and around the world amounted to \$1054.75. The finale was a wonderful choir 'The Ambassadors' comprising of about 24 people from various congregations in Adelaide. We were then treated to a sumptuous supper.
