See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame (1 Peter 2:6b).

[Read 1 Peter 2:1–10](#)

Several decades ago, when horses and bullocks were the means of transportation and toil, harness straps, hobbles and traces were used to assist the animals in providing the best efforts for the task at hand. Of course, some people misused this equipment, which caused discomfort and prevented good results.

Another example of this is how good building construction requires solid foundations, and before concrete, strong cornerstones provided the basis for solid footings. If this did not occur, then over time, the structure would lean and eventually topple over.

Today, this basic advice – if not practised – causes embarrassment to the provider and is a stress and burden to the user. If we fail to operate equipment without proper precautions or construct without the correct foundations, we and others are often deeply affected, even to significant physical and judicial hurt.

God has richly blessed us through Christ to be living stones, privileged to be used in building his kingdom. This is his promise! What's the alternative? We become a hindrance for other people.

But God chooses us. He gives us mercy, and who are we to deny that to others? What a right we have! And, of course, with every right, there is also responsibility. But we don't do it alone; God is always here.

Here I am, God. Use me as you will, not how I want. Amen

From the editor...



From Pastor Wayne...

*Hi! It's been good having a break away from the responsibilities of life and *being a pastor...* Jenine and I had a week together relaxing around home, and going out for various activities. So I'm sort of refreshed, although I am having trouble with my sleeping, *which doesn't leave me all that refreshed at times* 😊

*Choices, choices... Life is full of choices: little ones, and bigger ones. Each day is full of making little choices: what to eat for breakfast, how to spend your day, what clothes to wear, and so on. And then there are the bigger choices: who to have as your friends, the job that you choose, the marriage partner who you choose to have, whether you will have children or not, *and the list goes on.*

*Then there is the biggest choice of all: whether to listen to Jesus, God's Son, and to trust in him as our Saviour, and to follow him as our Lord. Jesus himself put this choice starkly when he said:

¹³ "Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road is easy that leads to destruction, and there are many who take it. ¹⁴ For the gate is narrow and the road is hard that leads to life, and there are few who find it (Matt. 7:13-14; cf. Luke 13:24).

*And if this is the biggest choice of all, *and I think that it most definitely is*, then the choice of growing our faith or not is just as important. For if we choose to drift along in our faith, rather than consciously seeking to grow it, then the danger is that our faith in God as our Loving Father and in Jesus as our Saviour and Lord becomes less and less important in our life, *and that before we know it we are travelling not on the narrow road but rather on the road that is easy and leads to destruction.*

*What does the choice to grow our faith involve? Well, let me suggest a few things that I think are important, *if we want to grow our faith:*

#Regular Worship

Each week, we have the choice of worshipping or not worshipping... Coming to church gives us the opportunity to hear what God has to say to us to encourage us in our walk with Jesus, the opportunity to give our thanks to God through Jesus, and the opportunity to meet Jesus in the Lord's Supper.

And if you can't worship on a particular Sunday due to ill health or family commitments, you can still worship with us using CHURCH@HOME which Angeline emails out: with the songs, the readings, and my message on YouTube.

#Personal Time with God

If we choose to grow our faith, rather than drift along in our faith, then spending time with God each day seems an important priority to me.

Choose a time and a place to read a portion of the Bible each day, and to spend time with God in prayer. When and how you do this will vary from person to person, but I think that it is important to choose to have a “Personal Time with God” each day.

#Joining a Bible Study Group

Also, being a part of a Bible Study Group is a valuable way to grow your faith and mine. We have a variety of options each week: “Know your Bible” groups on Monday night and Friday mornings; Pastor’s Bible Study on Tuesday mornings; and Bible Study with Rika after Coffee and Chat on Friday mornings.

However, I’d particularly like to challenge you to make the choice of being part of one of **our May Study Groups** as we focus is on the YouTube series, “The Chosen”, and as we look at Philip and Nathaniel; Mary, the mother of Jesus; the Canaanite woman; and Simon the Zealot. It is a choice that involves committing *just* four weeks to being part of a Bible Study group.

Come along and join us in one of our options: Home groups, Zoom groups, and Pastor’s Bible Study. Indicate your choice on the clipboard in the foyer, and we’ll sort out your group 😊

*May God bless you, and us as a community of faith here at Glynde, as we encourage one another and build one another up in our faith, and as we continue to reach out in any way that we can with the life transforming good news – no, the *great* news - of God’s love, and His forgiveness through Jesus.

From our Chairperson...

Make every effort

One of the most popular sports to watch in the Olympics is gymnastics. I must admit though, it's not one of mine! What I do acknowledge though, is the body control, grace, and power of these athletes is truly impressive. Throughout the world there are many young people that take gymnastics, and it is the dream of many of them to make it to the Olympics and win a gold medal. But even though so many would like to make it to the Olympics, few ever do.

This is because what it takes to achieve that goal is extreme. It affects every aspect of your life: what you eat, how you exercise and what you do with all your time. You have to strengthen your body and engrain your skills. You must reject anything that will keep your body from running at the optimal level. It is indeed a hard road that takes tremendous discipline, but for the few that can manage it, they achieve a dream that makes every bit of sacrifice worth it. The same could be said of any professional athlete.

In Luke 13:24 Jesus speaks of another path that requires even greater discipline and more comprehensive work, but it carries a reward to which nothing can compare. He says "*make every effort to enter through the narrow door.*" The Greek word he used here for "make every effort" contains the idea of "strive" or "struggle". Jesus makes it clear that the path through the Narrow Door cannot just be lazily achieved. Like the gymnast preparing for the Olympics who struggles with not satisfying her desire for junk food and skipping workouts, Christians also struggle to avoid spiritually harmful things. We do this because just as bad food harms a gymnast's performance, sin for the Christian hinders the Christian life. There is no harmless sin and so Jesus urges us to struggle against every sin and maintain the path that leads to that Narrow Door.

To be sure, we are not saved because of our works. We are saved by God's grace alone. But now that we are saved, God calls on us

to strive toward good things. Paul says it this way: *"I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me ... for which God has called me heavenward"* (Phil. 3:12)

Like a gymnast who is training for the Olympics, a Christian has no room in their lives for anything bad. Today set your goal on that Narrow Door. Strive for it, struggle for it and cut everything out that is harmful to that goal, because the eternal prize you will get there because of Christ's work for you is far better than any gold metal could ever be.

Our hall will also be used for election day only for the Federal election on May 21st.

Dear Friends in Christ

How exciting it was to welcome newcomers to Glynde (all through the week in Term 1), as the restrictions were lifted! God has been answering our prayers. He has shown His faithfulness.

Glynde community has so many activities throughout the week to become involved in and opportunities to show how much we value all people as precious in God's sight. We are so grateful that our volunteers are prepared to share their hospitality and good news through their words and attitudes.

There were more than 15 adult newcomers frequently taking part in the mid-week activities of our church during the last 3 months. Each one of them had their stories. Some were quick to share but with others it took time. However, one thing they had in common was the desire to belong, to be accepted and to be shown respect.

We thank God for how He worked in Glynde as we took interest in the curiosity of others, provided conversation starters, remembered names, listened to concerns and rejoiced in a shared humanity. We thank Him for the openness of prayer and for the friendships gained through a cup of coffee and/or a meal shared with those outside our immediate family circle.

We make ready plans for the term's activities but God had His means of providing more opportunities for personal and community growth. One event that impacted our activities this term was having the voting sited at Glynde. In response to increased visitation over this period, Playgroup and Grace Over Lunch was held at Drage Reserve. It seemed an inconvenience to take all our things (food, drink and toys) to the Reserve. However, it was a good way to introduce 'locals' at the Park, to come and see what we are doing. We also gained feedback from those who were coming to mid-week activities about how they felt about belonging and being engaged in Glynde mid-week activities.

Rika writes: I personally started working on Tuesday mornings. Thanks to the dedication of Wendy and Sigrid, Craft and Chat has about 20 people coming and enjoying their time together. I can hear their joyful sounds from the hall in my office, which is so delightful. They all do their individual work, but they still get together and share their stories over working on their projects. One of my friend's Mum comes along weekly. She repeatedly tells me that she is so thankful that there is somewhere she can go every week and be in merry sound. Her comment made me realise our busy lifestyle can leave some people

feeling isolated. God asks us how much time do we make and give to our neighbours as we give to ourselves? This use of our time for Others is, in a way, loving God and serving Him.

At mainly music, we have welcomed many new mums this term. Most of them got to know us through word of mouth or online information. What I have found was many of the Asian mums are Christians. It was a good surprise. However, as I have also experienced (as a mum of little babies or children), it is challenging to go to church on time regularly, or join a small group, to get fed spiritually. As well as them, there are mums who are not believers. Some are eagerly looking for the purpose of life or keen to absorb what is taught here. Some are not interested or rather hesitant to talk about the gospel. The interesting thing is, regardless of their thoughts about Christianity, they say they like to come here because people are friendly and warm. I believe they see Christ working in us. Furthermore, some have attended Church for kids and our Sunday service.

We see in the Bible how welcoming Jesus was. We can imagine his eyes and words full of love to those who feel lost, outcast, and lonely. His love is poured out on us enough for each day. My prayer is that God will renew our heart every day and His light of love keep shining through us.

In Term 2 at Bible study on Friday, we are going to read "Life Together" written by Dietrich Bonhoeffer. Up until now, our study was more focused on who we are in Christ but from now on, we would like to move forward to how we can serve one another practically as His disciples through prayer, worship in common, everyday work and Christian service. In Luke 13, it talks about a narrow door that leads to heaven, for there are many distractions and temptations on life's way. God is holy and His judgement is severe but in verses 30, 'Then those who are now last will be first, and those who are first, will be last'. His love overcomes our sin through the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross.

I believe Christianity is not about human perfectionism. We stumble and fall over so often, but the most important thing is to "repent", "go back" to God and "surrender" our heart that tries to be in control over our surroundings, including ourselves. This journey is challenging but with His loving care and guidance He can lead us safely home. *"To have faith, is to be sure of the things we hope for, to be certain of the things we cannot see". Hebrews 11:1*

We believe choosing a righteous path involves being open to trying out new ways of doing things, it involves not being afraid to do things outside our comfort zones and trusting God is with us.

Failure for us is when we put our own interests before others. Leadership is not just about having knowledge but trusting Jesus' promises. It involves a 'clean heart' (Psalm 51 v10) as well as seeing God's spirit in Other's service to Him, and giving thanks for their ways of showing love. The latter was most wonderfully experienced this term when a 'regular' person from Grace Over Lunch provided the lunch-time prayer. While Matthew 7 v 13 says we enter through the narrow gate, open wide though are the arms of God, and He would have all to be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth in His Son, our Saviour.

World Day of Prayer

World Day of Prayer, 2022 was celebrated at the Church of Christ, Maylands on March 4th. The Service was prepared by the women of England, Wales and Northern Ireland with the theme being "I know the plans I have for you" – plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.

It celebrated the stories of women who struggled in their daily life and found Jesus in various ways. The women still face many problems with violence in homes, living in poverty and living with disability.

The combined land area of these countries would fit into Australia 46 times and population consists of 65 million compared to Australia's 25 million.

The Symbol of the World Day of Prayer was developed by the women of Ireland in 1982 and is made up of persons kneeling in prayer, the Celtic cross and the circle representing the world and our unity through all our diversity.

Next year's Service will be held in the Anglican Church, Payneham, focus being Taiwan and theme being "I have heard about your faith" [Eph. 1.15]
