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# Love is a verb

**This is how we know what love is: Christ gave his life for us. We too, then, ought to give our lives for others! If we are rich and see others in need, yet close our hearts against them, how can we claim that we love God? My children, our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action.** (verses 16-18)

Love is a verb not a noun. Love isn't genuine unless it's shown in what we do. Love is action. It's a verb, a 'doing' word.

This means that if we *say* we love God we have to *do* something as well. To demonstrate love for God is to demonstrate love for others. Actions speak louder than words. Ask God to help you define the true meaning of love by what you do for others.

***Dear Jesus, I love you. Please help me to show this love in what I do for others. Amen.***

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# From Pastor Wayne...

Hi! Our theme for this month's AT GLYNDE is "**New possibilities**". As we begin this new year of 2019, what "new possibilities" excite you? Let me share with you what "new possibilities" excite me...

Before I do this, let me remind you of what we are 'on about' as God's people here at Glynde. Our MISSION STATEMENT gives us a summary of what we want to do here at Glynde for God:

**"To reveal and celebrate God's love..."**

How do we do that? By revealing the heart of God as we focus on Jesus, God's Son, and by responding in celebration as we praise God in worship, and with our songs and our prayers.

**"...so that all may know God through Jesus, and worship Him"**

That's what God wants us to do: to reach out to those around us with the Good News of God's love, and His forgiveness through Jesus. To empower us and to enable us to do this, we need also to build one another up in our faith. Hence the two goals that we focus on:

Inreach goal:

To encourage, upbuild, and equip one another, **so that we may grow in our faith and become more the outreaching, serving people that God wants us to be.**

Outreach goal:

**To reach out as a congregation and as individuals to the many hurting and lost people around us with the good news of God's love and forgiveness.**

In the light of our Mission statement and the Inreach and Outreach goals that we focus on here at *Church@Glynde*, let me share with you some of the "new possibilities" that excite me in our ministry together for our Lord here at Glynde:

**\*Our Cross-cultural ministries during the week really excite me.** Our

Playgroup, Mainly Music, Parenting and Marriage courses, Coffee and Chat, English class, and our Markets present all sorts of possibilities for reaching out to people from the community around us: to befriend and help and love them, and to share the good news of God's love and forgiveness as the opportunities present

themselves. As well, Barb Mattiske's new group on Wednesdays over lunch entitled *Grace Over Lunch* provides opportunities to care for people who have had contact with our mid-week groups.

**\*I pray that God will give us opportunities to share the good news of His love, and His forgiveness through Jesus, with the people who we have contact with in our mid-week ministries.** I look forward to us running *Alpha* with sub-titles, and the *Jesus DVD* again with sub-titles, so our mid-week people may meet Jesus and have their whole life transformed by the encounter.

**\*I love the fact that there are so many children in our 10.30 a.m. worship services each week, and that they are children from all sorts of ethnic backgrounds.**

What a joy it is to worship with so many children in our midst.

And what a joy it is to see so many children run out to Lighthouse Kids, our children's ministry each week. Thank God for all those who are involved in this ministry, and that this ministry presents many, many "new possibilities" each year.

**\*I look forward to the "new possibilities" that running home groups during May/June will present.** Last year, we ran the "Living Questionable Lives" program for five weeks, based on Michael Frost's book *Surprise the World*, which involved us forming habits spelt out by the word BELLS: Blessing, Eating, Listening to the Spirit, Learning from Jesus, and *being* Sent out into the world. This year, we will do something similar, *as far as methodology*, but different in terms of content: we will watch the three *God is not Dead* movies in our homes, and chat about them in small groups. Each of the movies provides much to stimulate our thinking and our life as God's people ☺

**\*I look forward to the various fellowship and study activities that we will have together this year,** and the new possibilities that they will bring into our lives. I think of our Lenten studies, for example, where we will watch the Centre for Public Christianity's movie *For the Love of God* together, and talk about it together; I think of our planned fellowship get-togethers; I think of a Wine and Cheese Discussion group for blokes; I think of the two six-week blocks of Bible study that we intend to have later in the year; and the list goes on and on.

Yes, there *is* much to excite us, as we think of "new possibilities" for this new year. May God bless us as we seek together to make a difference in our community for Him, as we reach out with His good news, *His life-transforming news*

# From the Chairperson ...

*2019 What will it mean for you?*

Scaffolding *n.* a temporary structure formed of poles, planks, etc, erected and used while building or repairing a house etc. [Oxford dictionary]

We have started the new year with wonderful messages from the Gospel of St Luke about the start of Jesus' public ministry and with scaffolding and repainting of the hall. It set me thinking about new beginnings and how do we reach the vision and mission of our church community here at Glynde for this year. I think we all need scaffolding in a conceptual sense - as part of our Christian life - to grow and understand God's word and our purpose and direction in our community of faith. So, how do we scaffold the life of our church? We do this through many ways, formally through our church constitution, our legal structure as an Incorporated body, our congregational meetings, our regular worship etc and less formally through all the activities and ministries that form the ways in which we serve Jesus and show his love to the community. We also need scaffolding in our personal faith and life. A vibrant and

growing church needs to do all these things and more.

The purpose of the Vision Day held last year was to provide a way of identifying the "scaffolding" that would support our church life for 2019. Pastor Wayne has summarised into a two page sheet of goals and actions. This Vision 2019 sheet will be further workshopped into our ministry teams in our Review and Mission night on Wednesday, 6 February and used as a guide for the year.

Some of the key areas relate to

- worship - involving more lay people, promoting ministry of women in our worship, offering informal cafe worship once per term
- welcoming and including new people - being conscious of visitors and new people and being friendly and caring; updating our welcome kit and having

- regular welcoming events e.g. Wednesday "Grace over lunch"
- encouraging and growing our newly formed Junior Youth Group
- offering new resources and focus on home study groups in May/June
- building stronger cross-cultural ministry activities and connections
- promote a calendar of fundraising activities - fun ways of socialising and raising money for our building redevelopment commitments and ministries
- increasing the profile of our Pastoral Assistants
- continue to develop the potential of our church amenities as a hub for the community around us.

Actions from our Annual General Meeting held in November last year will also need to be taken up - notably the adoption of a fully revised constitution. The details of the meeting to enable this to take place will be advertised soon. We will probably do this between services on a date to be determined by the Executive team when they meet in February.

Thank you to all who have offered their time, talents and gifts of stewardship to our church for this year. May God richly bless you as you help bind us together in a community that reveals and celebrates God's love so that all may know Jesus and worship him.

A special thanks to those who lead our ministries in paid roles - to Pastor Wayne, Pastor Henry, Barb Mattiske and Angeline Joimol - we thank God for you on a daily basis.

As we come off the highs of Christmas and New Year, and embrace the opportunities and challenges of this year, may the promises of God and his constant love be your scaffolding.

### *New possibilities*

For us, mid-week ministries are starting up or have just started for 2019 when you read this...

#### *What's new for us in 2019?*

Well, it's a different year, and there are always new people coming... People who have not come into this building before... people who haven't ever brought a child to Playgroup, or sung with their child at Mainly Music... or people who want to learn about Parenting, or how to speak English...

It's exciting that we can be a part of that community, getting to know new people, and getting to know those who already come even more!

Who knows what possibilities may arise from being here? Who knows what friendships may happen? Who knows what opportunities there will be to share God's love? So many possibilities... why not come and join us?

Did you know we have new possibilities this year... our new group *Grace over Lunch* starts on Wednesday February 6<sup>th</sup> at 11.30am... we are going to share cooking from different cultures as well as crafts... We are going to look at news items of the day and spend some time sharing and talking about God and his love for us. Did you know that one mum told me that when she first came to Australia she could understand around 30% of what was said... and that is concentrating hard! So... it can be pretty difficult to share a devotion time when language is so hard... it takes a lot of simplifying and a lot of help from everyone to be brave enough to share their thoughts with each other. To encourage with a smile and to talk a little slower. To be a friend. Could you be a part of that? We have such a great story to tell of Jesus' love... We pray that His grace will shower over us on Wednesdays!

Fridays is our Learning morning... We are starting a new Parenting course this term... it is the Alpha Parenting course for children up to around 10 years... For many of our parents it is the first time to look at parenting in Australia. For many, culture and tradition have been different. This course gives an opportunity for people to look at their own lives, how they grew up, and how that impacts them now as adults. It encourages people to create boundaries, use the love languages, to honour our cultural backgrounds, all with God as the centre... what an opportunity to again show God's love to those who come here...

English class is on at the same time, another opportunity to listen and love... watching people from so many backgrounds sharing together, encouraging and laughing, is so much fun to be a part of.



# Women's Retreat

The 60-plus women in attendance at the recent state-wide Lutheran women's retreat were oh, so thankful for the blessing of fabulous weather. Our Friday to Sunday were the three best days by far, in a fortnight of sweltering weather. For decades the venue has been Australian Lutheran College, in North Adelaide. However, 2019 was the very last time there, as accommodation facilities have ceased at ALC. There's now an exciting search going on to find a suitable venue for future years. Part of Saturday evening's program was a brainstorming session, allowing people to offer their ideas on this matter. They *definitely* want to see such retreats continue.

Having Pastor Nigel Rosenzweig as our chaplain gave a specific focus to our weekend's theme: *Pass It On*. **All** Christians have the commission to pass on the faith to people in our lives, but Nigel centred his presentations on **intergenerational** ministry. He works in the arm of the national church called *Grow Ministries*. So throughout the weekend's Bible study sessions he provided many examples of materials available to congregations and to families, to help **young people** develop their relationship with God. Churches are one of the few places in society where several generations are together. Family homes are the pivotal factor in keeping young people connected to their Christian faith, so it's crucial that we support parents as they model their love for God to their children.

Dorothee from our own congregation was our first guest speaker, telling us her absolutely fascinating family saga. They were of German ancestry, but many of her relatives had lived in Palestine, as it was called until the state of Israel was formed in 1948. We marvelled at the life of her family, especially her mother.

So, having looked **back** at past generations in that talk, we then had speakers who deal with the **new** generation. We heard from Tessa, whose LCC Foster Care office is upstairs in our church complex. She gave a heartfelt defence on behalf of the children in our state who need foster care. She was accompanied by Leonie, who has volunteered as a foster carer for 10 years, and who gave us insight into emergency care for babies up to 6 months. Not a dry eye in the room after that talk, as she described caring for newborns suffering from drug-withdrawal! Two such babies were with her in their pram, happily gurgling after spending 3 months with her so far.

*Blueprint Ministries* runs camps within SA for children, youth and young adults. At the same time as us, they happened to be having their own retreat day for camp directors nearby. So we were blessed with a whole line-up of young adults who took time out from that event to give us their personal take on camping ministry, and let us imagine a typical day at camp. All the women were suitably

impressed by the calibre of the young leaders. If you see an ad for a camp, encourage the young people in your life to attend. Different camps cater for primary school kids up to adults.

Singing sessions were enjoyed a few times over the weekend, along with games, jokes and quizzes. Retreats are always a time to just get away from usual routine, with delicious meals, no cooking or cleaning up to do, and the chance to meet new people and renew old friendships. It culminated in a communion service held in ALC's chapel, including a memorial time for those in our own circles who have died in the last year.

We also acknowledged the wonderful way that ALC's accommodation and catering services have been used for 50 years, but which are now at an end. Watch out for the venue for next year's retreat, on the third weekend of January.

## RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Have you ever had an argument?

Was the argument resolved to your satisfaction?

Did you agree to disagree?

Where do we look for answers to issues that can just be put down to another point of view, or, 'this has been my experience.'

These questions were asked during a lecture I attended at Australian Lutheran College some time ago. A friend and I decided that we have no rights, only responsibilities. Others were convinced that we certainly do have rights which are useful when resolving issues that seem ambiguous.

Our rights are plainly stated when having to face a court decision - we have a right to a defence if we have contravened the law of the land. Some rights can also be seen as privileges, such as driving a car, riding a bike on the footpath, or receiving Government payments. On what do we base our opinions?

We may opt to put our opinions aside or ignore the unpleasant feelings of hurt or guilt or even anger. We may feel that we do not have the knowledge or self worth to offer an opinion. Thinking that others are more worthy or more important than ourselves can lead to a time of anxiety or even depression. What is an alternative to negative responses?


We could attack others by gossiping about them, telling friends that 'they' upset me and they had no right to do that. Or, we could overlook the situation, ask for a time of mediation with a trusted person, seek God's intervention rather than go down a Slippery Slope that can lead to more trouble with no peace for anybody involved.



An opportunity is being given to us in March to attend a 2 day workshop at the LLL office. This workshop will offer Peacemaking Principles to respond to conflict biblically. I have found these workshops to be very inspiring as we learn to love God and love one another.

May the Spirit of God bless and motivate us to love as Jesus loved. DK


