# New Beginnings

**'For I am God, and not man – the Holy One among you. I will not come in wrath' (Hosea 11:9). [Read Hosea 11:1-4,8,9](#)**

Jesus told the story of a wayward son who had arrogantly left his father's house and wandered his own way. Finally, he realised how far he had gone and decided to return as a slave. Yet, his father stood with open arms ready to accept him again as a son. He gave his son a new beginning.

It was not a new story. It had been played out nearly 800 years earlier in the book of Hosea. The message of Hosea and the parable of the Waiting Father (Luke 15:11–32) is that God loves humanity so much that he has committed himself to us totally and beyond all expectations.

'For God so loved the world that he gave his only son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life' (John 3:16). That is the extent of his love.

In God, the Father for his Old Testament people, and for Jesus Christ with us, there are new beginnings. While we deserve nothing from him, and ought to be punished by him, our Lord has and continues to come to us in love and grace. He refuses to let his people go, even though we abandoned him.

Just like Hosea went to extreme lengths to call his adulterous wife back to him, so God in Christ has called, and continues to call, his disobedient and rebellious children back to him.

This is a message of love that will go to any lengths to bring reconciliation and restoration – so that we can have a new beginning every day.

It is also a message of hope to those who have given up because of what they have done or what has happened to them. This is a message that there are no such things as hopeless cases with God. All are special to him, and he sees all as being precious to him.

The good news for Israel was that they were given many new beginnings. The good news for us is the same. That goes beyond the boundaries of our human thinking. But then God is not a human being; he is the Holy One among us.

**Loving Lord Jesus Christ, we come humbly into your presence – not deserving anything from you – but receiving all we need to have peace, joy and hope. Give us a new start every day, free from any fear of your judgement, and confident in your mercy. In your name, we pray. Amen.**

## From our Cross-Cultural Coordinator...

Dear Friends in Christ,

Rick Warren, author of, *A Purpose-Driven Life* stated, "joy is the settled assurance that God is in control of all the details of my life, the quiet confidence that ultimately everything is going to be alright and the determined choice to praise God in every situation".

Paraphrasing what this means, it would seem that joy is something that empowers our lives when we see the love of Christ in His Word and see Him active in the world through His people.

The scientific explanation of joy defines joy as an emotion, a feeling released by chemicals (dopamine and serotonin) heavily associated with happiness. Yet joy, like love, cannot be confined to such limitations. What this knowledge explains to me is that joy is part of human existence, it's God's way of encouraging us in ways that are positive and life sustaining for others. He wants us to know joy. He wants to give us joy. He wants us to have a positive outlook on life, as a matter of fact He gives us reason for having a positive outlook and He enables us to pursue that joy.

Pursuing joy and applying it to our lives is found in many parts of the Bible. Nehemiah speaks of it, "the joy of the Lord is YOUR strength" (Nehemiah 8v10). Paul in Philippians spoke about Christian joy and of pressing on, striving towards the goal which is eternal life (3v12).

During Advent, Christmas and now the Epiphany we have felt our sins, have seen the Cross over the manger and have seen God's provision of love and salvation; all great reasons to hear the spiritual calling of being joyous people. We pray the epiphany of this revelation will guide our living and ways of relating to the world in this new year of grace.

Since reporting last about our mid-week ministry, we have had only one, short recess (due to the November Covid outbreak) at Glynde. After this outbreak numbers returned to their "normal". So keen were students to come to class that when the markets were held at the church, one of the classes met in the children's playgroup area.

There was a good feeling in the soul at Saturday English classes as we went into our pre-Christmas time. Dot Turner chose to look at carols. We were able to sing in Mandarin and English, "Hark the Herald Angels Sing" with some angelic voices creating a joyous, thankful experience. In this experience we were all reminded of our shared humanity and the joy of Christmas. As well, the nativity art work in the foyer enabled the teachers to tell of the story of Christmas and its importance in their lives.

Playgroup continued with a repeat group of 6-8 families. The video, *Who's that knocking?* Was a joyous way of presenting the Christmas story.

Mainly music attendance averaged 15-17 families each week. One of the highlights was having nine graduates from the group who were mostly all smiles as they took their certificates from Barbara. Alyssa Leach one of our brilliant 'Blue Wiggles' presenters was given a farewell and thanked for her invaluable role over the years. The wonderful presenters are pictured below and really know how to bring joy to children.

At Grace Over lunch we looked at traditions of Christmas, had wonderful merry cherry tarts by Tony, shared pizza and looked forward to meeting again in 2021. Thirty-five recipes for the year were compiled into a recipe book.

I have no doubt that God is in control of our lives and I pray that together we can continue to remind each other of His great love for us. I pray we will always seek to have an outlook that sees the Other as God's gift to us and in that knowledge have the inner joy, peace and confidence in God's gracious will for us in our lives.

# How's your diet?
