IN WORSHIP TODAY

The 9am service Bible readings are from the New International Version (UK) Bible: [Acts 2:14a,36-41](#) and [1 Peter 1:17-23](#). The gospel reading [Luke 24:13-35](#).

The 10:30am service Bible reading is from the Good News Translation Bible, [Luke 24:13-35](#).

The theme and message for both our worship services today is "Recognising Jesus in the breaking of the bread" and is based on Luke 24:13-35.

Have you ever bumped into someone you previously knew quite well but they didn't recognize you? It's embarrassing, isn't it? Especially if you have to introduce yourself to them as if you were a complete stranger.

Something like that happened when Jesus encountered the two disciples travelling to Emmaus in today's Gospel. Presumably they knew Jesus quite well but somehow, they didn't recognize him. Jesus then proceeded to guide them through the Scriptures, showing how they all pointed to him and his saving mission. At first, they didn't recognize Jesus, but afterwards they knew him at a whole new level.

In the climax of the story, Jesus again revealed himself to them so that they were able to recognize him and know him in a much deeper way. Jesus did this through the breaking of bread (a technical term in the early Church for Holy Communion). The penny dropped and the two disciples finally understood. They were so excited they immediately rushed all the way back to Jerusalem to tell the other disciples!

This is how Jesus continues to reveal himself to us today: through the Scriptures and in the Lord's Supper. Jesus reveals himself in a deeper, more intimate, way so that we can truly know who he is and trust in what he has done to save us. In the end, recognizing Jesus is ultimately about confessing him as your Lord and Saviour. So, the question is: Do you recognize Jesus? May God help you to do so.

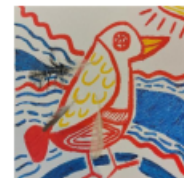

Pastor Philippe-Jacques Oster was born in Strasbourg, France, was a Minister in the Église Chrétienne de la Confession d'Augsbourg and served as a missionary across France. He accepted a call to the congregation in Posen, Prussia where he subsequently received a call to Australia and set sail with his family and some members of his congregation in 1847. He was formational in the lives of two future Lutheran synod presidents and other leaders in the Lutheran community Australia.

In 1836 he was convicted in Metz for holding religious gatherings in his house. This presentation will look at his appeal in the Cour de Cassation in Paris (the highest court in France) and what we can learn from this for religious freedom today.

The presenter is Dr Lisa Schmidt, who in her time as Executive Director of Lutheran Education Australia was responsible for multiple submissions to the Australian Commonwealth government on religious freedom on behalf of the LCA. She is also a descendant of Pastor Oster.
