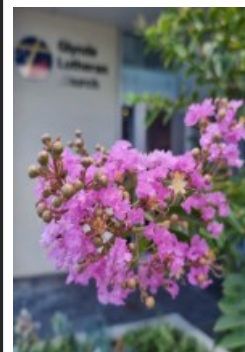

IN WORSHIP TODAY

Our Bible Readings for our 9am and 10.30am worship services are from the Good News Translation Bible.

For the 9am worship service, they are [Deuteronomy 8:7-18](#) and [2 Corinthians 9:6-15](#). The gospel reading is [Luke 17:11-19](#).

The bible reading for the 10.30am worship service is [Luke 17:11-19](#).

The theme and message for both worship services are "Samaritan Returns Thanks" and is based on Luke 17:11-19.

Today's sermon was originally preached in October 2022 by Pastor Nick Mullen of Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, Everton Hills, Queensland.

Luke 17:11-19 has the account of Jesus healing 10 lepers, with only one of them, an outsider, coming back to thank him for the miraculous healing. In America this encounter is often used as the text for sermons on Thanksgiving Day in November every year, encouraging listeners to be more thankful.

It certainly is good for everyone in society if we are thankful for what we have in our lives, but thankfulness does not come naturally to us. We try to teach kids to say thank you. However, just *trying* to be better at being thankful really concentrates on the *Law* aspect of the Bible. We know we fail to live up to the standard of God's law. So that points us back to the good news of Jesus, who paid for our imperfect lives.

The gospel aspect of this healing story, is that Jesus did *not* punish the 9 lepers who failed to say thank you for their healing. His love and healing is for everyone, including outsiders. That's true both in Bible times, and nowadays. When we acknowledge our need, and rely on the faith he has given us, and not on our *own* efforts, he will produce the *fruits* of faith, including thankfulness.

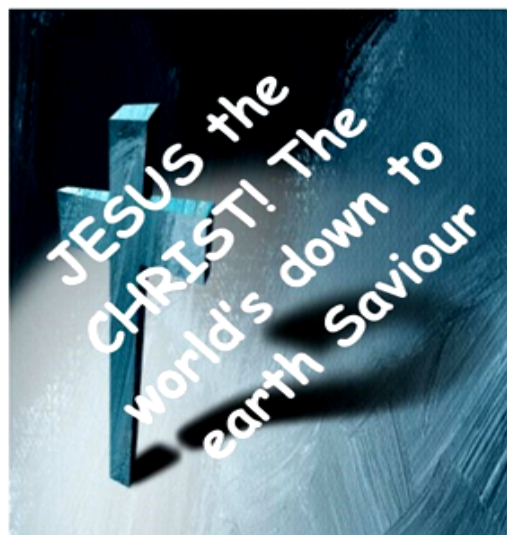
