IN WORSHIP TODAY

Our Bible Readings for our 9am and 10.30am worship services are from the Good News Translation Bible. Genesis 18:1-15

For the 9am worship service, they are <u>Genesis 18:1-15</u> and <u>Romans 5:1-8</u>. The Gospel Reading is <u>Matthew 9:35 - 10:8</u>.

The bible reading for the 10.30am worship service is Matthew 9:35 - 10:8.

The theme and message for both our worship services today is "Jesus sends us out with such Good News" and is Matthew 9:35 – 10:8, Romans 5:1-8.

"A sociologist writing a study on parenting interviewed a mother of 13 children. The interviewer asked, 'Do you think all your children deserve full, impartial love?' The mother replied, 'Of course.' Trying to catch her out, the interviewer asked: 'Which do you love most?' The mother answered: 'The one who is sick until he gets well, and the one who is away until he gets home." It is when we were sick in sin and far from home that God loved us most, that he was most occupied with us and went out of his way to save us."

In today's Gospel and Epistle Jesus goes out of his way for the lost and those in most need, and then sends us out to do the same. He sends us out to tell the Good News of Jesus and share the compassion of Jesus. Our homes and communities and world desperately need such compassion and Good News. God loves the world so much. Friends of Lutheran Archives (FoLA) The **29**th **June gathering** of FoLA will feature Dr Christine Lockwood's talk on Missionary Christian Gottlob Teichelmann – a life of patient endurance. Teichelmann served as missionary among the Kaurna people of the Adelaide Plains 1838 to 1846. He became an advocate of justice for Aboriginal people shattered by colonisation, and a critic of colonial policy and practice as he sought to share the gospel while providing for Aboriginal needs. He was finally defeated by inadequate financial support and colonial opposition. Teichelmann's language work has been the primary basis for the reclamation of Kaurna language and identity.
