IN WORSHIP TODAY

Our Bible Readings for our 9am and 10.30am worship services are from the Good News Translation Bible.

For the 9am worship service, it is <u>Ephesians 5:8-14</u>, and the gospel reading is Mark 1:14-20.

The bible reading for the 10.30am worship service is Mark 1:14-20.

The theme and message for both our worship services today is "Reflections on following Jesus" and based on Mark 1:14-20

This morning we will be reflecting on what it means to follow Jesus. To help us do that, I will be unpacking a model that I have developed in teaching a *Christian Spirituality* Unit at ALC. This model depicts visually the various elements that make up Christian spirituality.

Spirituality **includes all five elements** of Identity; Connections (community); Beliefs; Practices; and Meaning. Furthermore, our spirituality needs to be seen as being **the sum (combination) of all these five elements**.

When it comes to following Jesus, **each** of these elements of our spirituality comes into play. In other words:

- **being a follower of Jesus** shapes our **identity** for we are people who are loved by Jesus and saved by him. Through our faith in Jesus and in our baptism, we are God's forgiven children and heirs of eternal life;
- being a follower of Jesus calls us into community where we live out our new identity in Christ in love and service of others – as the Body of Christ - in Jesus' name and empowered by the Holy Spirit, to the glory of God the Father;
- **being a follower of Jesus** is an expression of our **belief** in Jesus as our saviour. This means trusting Jesus to save us and to lead us through life. This belief in Jesus determines our worldview and values. It lies at the heart of who we are and how we live our lives;
- being a follower of Jesus determines how we live and what we do (our practices). These practices are how we live out our faith and in doing so they also strengthen our faith and identity. Many of these are communal practices which assist us in loving and serving others;
- **being a follower of Jesus** results in our identity, connections, beliefs, and practices collectively (together) giving **meaning** and purpose to our life. Finally, we should note that all five aspects of spirituality are **connected** to the others and are properly understood together. Furthermore, a healthy spirituality is when all these elements are **integrated** in your life. Perhard Floar




