IN WORSHIP TODAY

Our Bible Readings for both our worship services are from the Good News Translation Bible version.

For the 9am worship service, they are <u>Exodus 14:19-31</u> and <u>Romans 14:1-12</u>. The Gospel Reading is <u>Matthew 18:21-35</u>.

The bible reading for the 10.30am worship service Matthew 18:21-35.

The theme and message for both our worship services today is "The Power of Forgiving Seventy-Seven Times" and is based on Matthew 18:21-35.

Have you ever wondered about forgiveness? Peter, one of disciples, once asked Him, "Jesus, if someone from our church hurts me, should I forgive them seven times?" And do you know what Jesus said? He said, "Not just seven times, Peter, but seventy-seven times."

Now, forgiving someone so many times might sound tough. Jesus was trying to show us that forgiveness should be endless, like how God forgives us again and again. It's not about counting, but about having a heart full of forgiveness.

Think about David from the Bible. He forgave Saul, who wanted to hurt him. David knew it wasn't easy, but he didn't hide from the difficulty. He prayed to God for strength and safety from his enemies. This shows us that acknowledging our pain and praying for strength are essential steps in forgiveness.

You see, forgiveness is a healing process. It's like setting yourself free from a prison of anger and bitterness. Nelson Mandela, a great leader, spent a long time in prison but chose forgiveness over hatred. He showed us that forgiveness can set us free.

When Jesus talked about forgiving seventy-seven times, He meant we should forgive like God forgives us. Forgiveness is a gift we received freely from God and He wants us to forgive others. It's a journey towards healing, letting go of the past, and finding peace in our hearts.

So, let's remember to forgive, not because it's easy, but because it's a beautiful gift we can give, just like how God gives us grace and forgiveness. May the Holy Spirit guide us in understanding and embracing forgiveness in our lives.

Chairperson's Update

Installation of Pastor Richard Fox

Plans for the installation of Richard on the 29th October at 4pm are in progress. Bishop of the LCANZ SA/NT, Andrew Brook, will be the officiating pastor. For those who are used to coming to church on a Sunday morning, there are plans for an informal coffee & chat time earlier in the day. Further details on that will be advertised.

Pastor Richard's church office will be upstairs, the first door on your right as you walk in. You will likely see Richard floating around a lot though with his mobile office!

Upstairs tenancy

Conversations and negotiations continue in regard to some of the office space upstairs. Hopefully we will have some good news in the not-too-distant future.

Fostering Integration Grant

Hopefully you have seen already some of the results of getting this grant, with the area being redeveloped outside the hall and playgroup room. Final landscaping of this area is happening in the next few weeks, and shortly afterwards, new carpet will be going in the playgroup room. Also in that room, we have now got a new TV installed, which has already benefited the parenting course held on Tuesdays. This space is now much more flexible and versatile for usage by any groups, especially if you require a smart TV, and to connect to a laptop or phone. We are also investigating new blinds for the windows.

Look out for information on a celebration day to be held in November, celebrating this redevelopment and also acknowledging the 10th anniversary of holding Mainly Music in our church community.

Volunteer Grant

We were fortunate to also be successful in receiving a smaller volunteer grant, which we have used to purchase a laptop and tablets to be used for Mid-week ministries, and in particular, English classes. Money has also gone towards the purchase of a much better second-hand coffee machine and grinder, which was badly needed. We have already received very favourable comments about the coffee improvement!

AV/Sound upgrade


We are in the process of tweaking a few things with our sound desk and the addition of a link to the computer to allow streaming of services in the future. Additionally, we are installing speakers in the overflow, foyer, and hopefully the kitchen, to allow people to hear what's happening in the church from those locations better. Also the installation of a cable to the overflow from the sound desk computer, to allow connection to a screen showing the same as what's on the screen in the church.

Referendum Polling Place

Our church hall will again be used as a polling venue for the referendum on Saturday October 14th. Apart from a little bit of rental income, it's always a great opportunity to 'show off' our community here at Glynde to the wider public, promoting our ministries and what we do, and can be an extra fundraiser if we can organise some stalls and BBQ.


